The June 17th meeting of the Allenstown Public Library Board of Trustees was called to order at 5:00 PM by Jeff and seconded by Mandy.

Items:

- Agenda minutes from May 20 meeting were reviewed and ready to be posted. Jeff moved to accept the minutes with the change and Kathleen seconded.
- Review Director's report and items from the agenda.
 - O Betsi has given another design for the new sign. Have asked the library name to be made more even and to put the flourish above and below the whole name, not just Allenstown.
 - o Mt. Washington pass was just for June, so it is not worth the money.
 - O Having trouble figuring out who to create a poll on the website.
 - O Schools' visits went well, and the kids seemed really excited to visit again.
 - O Summer reading signups have begun and are going well. Summer reading officially begins next week.
 - o \$7,500 in donations for the summer reading program.
 - O The donated plants from Merrimack County Conservation were in rough shape, so the Pembroke/Allenstown Garden Club has taken them to nurse them back to help and will plant them at the library when they are ready.
 - O May statistics- Parton Visits- 163, Checkouts- 338, Online checkouts- 290, New Patrons 8 Crafts- 53, Spice Kits- 20, Facebook- people reached- 1,442, Facebook- post engagements-205

- O Library hours
 - A survey on the new hours for Fall and how they may feel about them starting in the Fall
 on the Allenstown Library page. TBD based on polling. Any updates? Mandy will think
 on ideas for Betsi to see if she can help with polling.
- O Friends of the library- trying to see if we can get a volunteer to do this. Can do fundraising and grants we cannot apply for. Kathleen and Jeff may have someone in mind. Will reach out and see if there is interest in this. Kathleen needs to reach out to her contact and see if Jeff has. Jeff has not reached out yet but will! Will see if Kathleen has updates. Jeff's contact is not interested at this time. Kathleen will follow up with Kate.
- O Sign- is now the right time with the outcry when fire and police got theirs with the budget cuts? If we get a new sign now, is the timing right with the citizens of the town being upset about the new fire and police signs? If this is something we should pause on for now? Can still get quotes and gather information and then decide when the best time would be to purchase. Maybe we can lock in prices even if we pause and see if we can install in April instead.
- O Goals ideas (carried over but we can get quotes on):

- Volunteer opportunities

New business.

- It has been suggested that if we go in default budget that folks will suggest cutting the library as a budget cost savings. There may be some sharing of this idea in the town. Investors in a town want to see schools, arts and such so they will put their business there. Perhaps prepare an all-up report on the previous year, the grants we receive and the history of the building. Embracing this with open arms to offer what we offer to the community, and this is what they are getting from it. Also stress the economic importance as well. Kathleen and Jeff can reach out or if Betsi wants to reach out to offer a chance to educate. If we have a candid, that would list the foundations and trusts in America that would give grants and such that is open to the public to apply for. Depends on the cost for a library? If it is a cheaper cost then that is a draw for folks into the library as well. Can Betsi also advertise on Facebook when she wins a grant as well, so the public is informed, the summer reading etc.
- O Parking on off hours question.- Have noticed folks parking in our spaces on weekends and off hours. Are we ok with that? Said we are ok as long as not during business hours and as long as not when we plow. If we change hours, we would have to notify them.
